## **OUT OF MY MIND**

Later this month we will celebrate one of my favorite holidays, Thanksgiving. Not only do I enjoy the wonderful foods we eat on that special day, but I also appreciate how we all pause for a moment to express our gratitude to God for who he is and all that he has done in our lives.

This month I have a special reason to be thankful for I am observing my 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary as a pastor. On Sunday, November 5, 1978, I became the pastor of the Dry Valley Baptist Church in Lodiberg, Kentucky. (It's one of those "you can't get there from here" places) I was a student in seminary at the time and I am profoundly grateful to the 40 or so people who gathered each Sunday in a small, white, clapboard church building and put up with me as I slowly began to learn how to be a pastor. (That's a process that continues to this day!)

Since then, I have had the privilege of pastoring four additional churches, including Manly Memorial. Over these 40 years of Christian ministry I have preached more sermons than I can count, shed tears at far too many funerals, celebrated at far too few weddings, and have not had nearly enough opportunities to rejoice at baptisms.

I could not have reached this 40th anniversary without the assistance of many wonderful people of God both in and out of the churches I have served. For each of you who take the time to encourage, support and pray for me, I am more grateful than mere words can express.

I am especially grateful to my wife Lucy for her unwavering support through all these years of ministry and life that we have shared together. Without her love, understanding, patience, support, encouragement, counsel and consoling, I could not be a pastor. From the very beginning, we have viewed this ministry as a partnership to which we have both been called by God, and I could not do what I do, without her doing so very well all that she does. These years of ministry have not always been easy, but as we have looked back, we can see that they were always filled with God's grace and goodness.

I am thankful to God for the privilege of serving him as a pastor, and especially as the pastor of this wonderful church, and look forward to sharing more anniversaries together with you.

It is not to late to fill a shoebox or 2 or more! The deadline for returning boxes is **Sunday**, **November 11**th. As you have seen in the clips on Sunday mornings, these boxes mean so much to those who receive them and for some, it is their first experience with presents and their first introduction to the gospel.

Our project for **November** is hygiene bags for Fluvanna Women's Correctional Center. Each gallon size zip lock bag should include the following:

One individually wrapped toothbrush
One tube of toothpaste (6 oz. size in original container)
One deodorant stick (2.6 oz. - no spray or roll-on)
One bottle of shampoo (as close to 15 oz. but no larger)
One bottle of lotion (as close to 15 oz. but no larger)

Other items which can be donated include greeting cards of all types, stationery items (writing paper and envelopes), Forever stamps, wooden pencils (unsharpened). Monetary donations may be made to GraceInside and marked FCCW Resource Fund. Please give these donations to Molly Kay Moore so they can be directed to the proper person. **The deadline for all donations is Sunday, November 18**<sup>th</sup>.




Our Children's Choir will sing during the worship service on **Sunday, November 11<sup>th</sup>.** They will rehearse in the sanctuary at 10:15 am.
